Delta Air Lines to Add Service from PHL to Boston

PHILADELPHIA – Delta Air Lines has announced that it will add non-stop service from Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) to Boston Logan International Airport (BOS) beginning October 1, 2018.

Delta, the third largest airline at PHL in terms of passenger traffic, will operate four daily departures to Boston, which is the fourth most popular domestic destination from PHL, with CRJ-900 aircraft.

“Boston is a popular choice among both business and leisure travelers, and the new service by Delta will make traveling between two great cities even more convenient,” said Airport CEO Chellie Cameron. “We are very pleased with this new service and look forward to more flights to more cities.”

Currently, American Airlines and JetBlue operate non-stop flights from PHL to Boston.
