Frontier Airlines to Add New Service at PHL

PHILADELPHIA – Low-cost carrier Frontier Airlines will add two new non-stop destinations from Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) in the spring with seasonal service to Birmingham (BHM) and Savannah (SAV).

These new routes will increase Frontier's annual destinations from PHL to 27, making it the second largest airline in Philadelphia after hub carrier American Airlines. The Birmingham and Savannah announcement comes one week after Frontier announced it would add seasonal non-stop service from PHL to Grand Rapids and Indianapolis starting April 9 and to Dallas-Fort Worth beginning May 17.

"We are excited that Frontier continues to grow their network out of Philadelphia," said Airport CEO Chellie Cameron. "Both business and leisure travelers are benefitting from more flights to more cities."

Frontier's non-stop service to Birmingham will depart on Wednesdays and Saturdays starting April 11. Service to Savannah will operate Tuesdays and Fridays starting May 1.

American Airlines currently serves Birmingham and Savannah from PHL.

Philadelphia International Airport is owned and operated by the City of Philadelphia. The Airport is a self-sustaining entity that operates without the use of local tax dollars. It is one of the largest economic engines in Pennsylvania, generating an estimated \$15.4 billion in spending annually and supporting more than 96,300 full-time jobs for the 11-county Philadelphia MSA.
