More Frontier Airlines Flights Will Be Taking Off at PHL

Airline adds service to seven new cities from Philadelphia International Airport

PHILADELPHIA – Frontier Airlines, which brought its “Low Fares Done Right” service to Philadelphia International Airport a decade ago, has announced that it will begin non-stop flights between PHL and four new cities beginning in December and an additional three new cities in the Spring 2015.

The Denver-based carrier will introduce daily non-stop flights to Miami, Orlando and Tampa on December 20 and will begin operating flights five days a week to Cancun on December 21. Frontier will start daily non-stop flights to Atlanta, Charlotte, and Chicago in the Spring 2015.

To celebrate the new service, on September 30 only, Frontier is offering \$14.99 one-way fares from PHL to Miami, Orlando and Tampa on specific dates. Introductory one-way fares of \$59-\$99 to and from PHL to Miami, Orlando, Tampa and Cancun on specific dates are available through October 6.

“We are very excited that Frontier Airlines is expanding its presence at Philadelphia International Airport,” said Airport CEO Mark Gale. “This added service gives travelers in the region access to more low-fare flights to some of the most popular destinations. More choices mean more competition, which is good for the consumer.”
