5 Things to Know If You Are Flying Out of PHL This Holiday Season

If you are flying out of Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) during the holidays, here are five things to keep in mind.

- Don't look for a US Airways sign. US Airways has merged with American Airlines. If you are flying American, check your terminal as well as departure gate before you arrive at the Airport so you know where to check in and go through TSA screening. American flights depart from Terminals A-West, A-East, B, C and F.
- The new E-F Secure Corridor has opened so passengers can walk to and from Terminal F without having to go through security screening a second time. It's about a 15-minute walk between F and C Terminal.
- If you're parking at the Airport, check space availability at each garage online.
- If you see something, say something. Tell a police officer or call 3111 from a white courtesy phone. Safety is everyone's business.
- Check out our popular holiday entertainment. Most entertainers perform weekdays at the B/C Food Court stage. Schedules are posted at Information Counters.

This year, Philadelphia International Airport celebrates the 75th anniversary of its commercial air service. In 1940, the Airport served 40,000 passengers flying to a handful of cities. Today, more than 30 million passengers travel annually to 131 destinations around the world.
