## Philadelphia International Airport Hosts PHL Job Fair

Employers Seeking to Fill 200 Positions and Hiring On-the-Spot

**PHILADELPHIA** - The Philadelphia International Airport (PHL), in partnership with City of Philadelphia Council President Darrell Clarke, is hosting a job fair to fill immediate openings at businesses at PHL.

The job fair will be held this coming Monday, May 12, 2014, from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm at the Liacouras Center, 1776 North Broad Street in Philadelphia on Temple University's Main Campus.

More than 30 Airport partners including airlines, restaurants, retail shops, rental car organizations, and government agencies are looking to fill over 200 jobs. Employers are prepared to hire candidates on-the-spot for positions as customer service representatives, sales associates, bartenders, managers, assistant managers, supervisors, cashiers, and many more.

"Last year more than 1300 job seekers attended the PHL Job Fair. This year we anticipate seeing more. This job fair not only benefits both job seekers and employers at PHL, but helps to ensure that residents in the area have the first opportunity to fill open positions in businesses at PHL," said Airport CEO Mark Gale.

Job seekers will register with their resumes at the PHL Job Fair and will be given a map that lists participating employers. Clearly marked way-finding and booth signage will aid both job seekers and potential employers in making the most of their time invested at the PHL Job Fair. In order to prepare for a job interview, attendees should please wear professional business attire, dress for success and bring multiple copies of their resumes. However, job seekers without resumes or business attire ensembles are still encouraged to attend.

Philadelphia International Airport is owned and operated by the City of Philadelphia. The Airport is a self-sustaining entity that operates without the use of local tax dollars. It is one of the largest economic engines in Pennsylvania, generating an estimated \$14.4 billion in spending to the regional economy and accounting for more than 141,000 jobs.
